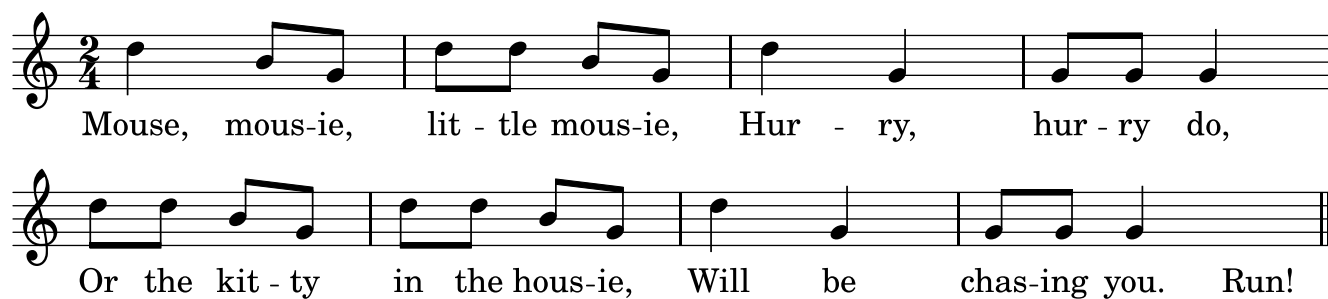

	The children sit in a circle. One child is secretly designated as the “mouse”. Another child, the “cat”, steps outside the circle. The children sing the song as the cat walks around the outside of the circle. At the end of the song the children shout “Run!” The mouse runs around the outside of the circle in an attempt to get back to place before being caught by the cat.
