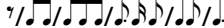
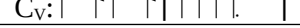

C6. Additional Research Notes

Child ballad #2, Roud Folk Song Index #12. An American variant of the traditional English ballad in the dorian mode. "Scarborough" refers to Scarborough, North Yorkshire, England. During the Middle Ages, Scarborough Fair was a 45-day trading event, starting on August 12th through the end of September. Scarborough is a seaside town, making it a key location for trade. The name comes from a Royal Charter by King Henry III of England on January 22, 1253. The charter gave Scarborough special privileges and codifying the date. It was not attended only by merchants, as they needed to be fed and provided entertainment. The Fair officially ceased in 1788, due to competition with other fairs and increasing taxation.
